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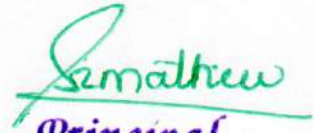
Anti-Ragging Cell

The college established an anti-ragging committee as per UGC regulations. Ragging is strictly prohibited both inside and outside the campus. Anyone found guilty of ragging, encouraging ragging either directly or indirectly, or being part of a conspiracy to encourage ragging faces consequences under UGC Regulations (No. UGCD-Rag/C/96(15)/SCHE/2009), which were distributed on April 13, 2009. Ragging is completely outlawed in the college.

Objectives

The objective of the Anti-Ragging Committee is to serve as an advising and monitoring body to maintain a culture free from ragging on college campuses. The following are this cell's primary objectives:

1. To make the students aware of the perversity and degrading effects of ragging.
2. To continuously monitor and keep an eye out for ragging to stop it from happening again.
3. To take immediate and severe action against any instances of ragging that are brought to our attention.
4. To establish a culture of discipline by making it abundantly evident that ragging will not be accepted and that it will always be detected and dealt with.

Anti-Ragging Policy

In accordance with the 2016 UGC Anti-Ragging Rules in Higher Education, directed by the Honorable Supreme Court, the college provides a healthy campus atmosphere for all students with the goal of preventing and eliminating ragging.

What Constitutes Ragging

Ragging constitutes one or more of the following acts:

5. Any conduct by any student or students, whether by words spoken or written or by an act, which has the effect of teasing, treating, or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student.
6. Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts, or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher.
7. Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
8. Any act of physical abuse, including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts or gestures, causing bodily harm, or any other danger to health.
9. Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student, with or without an intent to derive sadistic pleasure or show off power, authority, or superiority over a fresher or any other student.


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Objectives of the Anti-Ragging Committee

The Anti-Ragging Committee will be the supervisory and advisory committee in preserving a culture of a ragging-free environment on the college campus. The main objectives of this cell are as follows:

10. To make students aware of the dehumanizing effect of ragging inherent in its perversity.
11. To keep a continuous watch and vigil over ragging so as to prevent its occurrence and recurrence.
12. To stringently deal with incidents of ragging brought to our notice.
13. To generate an atmosphere of discipline by sending a clear message that no act of ragging shall be tolerated and no act of ragging shall go unnoticed or unpunished.

As per the order of the Supreme Court of India and subsequent notification from the University Grants Commission (UGC), ragging constitutes one or more of the following intentions by any student or group of students:

14. Any act of indiscipline, teasing, or handling with rudeness.
15. Any act that prevents or disrupts regular academic activity.
16. Any activity likely to cause annoyance, hardship, psychological harm, fear, or apprehension.
17. Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure.
18. Any act of physical abuse causing assault, harm, or danger to health.
19. Any act of abuse by spoken words, emails, SMS, public insult, etc.
20. Any act of injury or infringement of the fundamental right to human dignity.
21. Any act of wrongful confinement, kidnapping, molesting, committing unnatural offences, use of criminal force, trespass, or intimidation.
22. Any unlawful assembly or conspiracy to rag.

Measures for Prevention of Ragging at the College Level

The college shall take the following steps in regard to the admission or registration of students:

23. The admission brochure, instruction booklet, or prospectus shall prominently print and contain a warning against ragging, including the consequences.
24. Students shall be provided with the telephone numbers of the Anti-Ragging Helpline and all important functionaries in the college, including members of the Anti-Ragging Committee.
25. The college shall make induction arrangements, including those that anticipate, identify, and plan to meet any special needs of specific sections of students, well in advance of the beginning of the academic year, with an aim to promote the objectives of anti-ragging.
26. The college may seek the assistance of professional counsellors before the commencement of the academic session, to be available when required for offering counselling to freshers and other students after the commencement of the academic year.

Administrative Action in the Event of Ragging

The college shall punish a student found guilty of ragging after following the prescribed procedure and manner:

27. The Anti-Ragging Committee of the college shall take an appropriate decision regarding punishment or otherwise, depending on the facts of each incident and the nature and gravity of the established incident of ragging.
28. The Anti-Ragging Committee may, depending on the nature and gravity of the guilt established by the Anti-Ragging Squad, award one or more punishments to those found guilty.
29. Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
30. Debarring from appearing in any test, examination, or other evaluation process.
31. Suspension or expulsion.

The college has taken measures to counsel students about gender sensitivity and maintains 24/7 CCTV surveillance so that there are no incidents in the college.

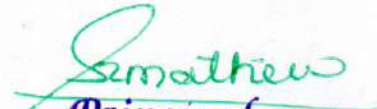
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Punishment to Those Found Guilty

Any student or group of students found guilty of ragging on the campus or even outside the campus shall be liable to one or more of the following punishments:

32. Debarring from appearing in any sessional test or University Examination.
33. Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
34. Withdrawing scholarships and other benefits.
35. Suspension from the college.
36. Cancellation of admission.
37. Withholding the results.
